

International schools in Sweden

Sweden has a large number of international schools. Some are boarding schools. Students are mainly children of foreign business people, diplomats, researchers and others living in Sweden for various lengths of time. Students are also Swedes who desire an international education. The schools are listed in alphabetical order.

Schooling is obligatory in Sweden from 7 through 16 years of age. Preschool is voluntary, and is intended to children younger than 7 years. The international schools generally apply either American or British curriculum and grade levels. The Swedish curriculum, followed by some schools, consists of primary level (lågstadium), 1 through 3 grades; middle school (mellanstadium) grades 4 through 6; junior high school (högstadium) grades 7 through 9; and high school (gymnasium) grades 10 through 12. In the table below, class levels are given according to the American system.

Tuition fees may vary according to the residence status of the student. Those who are Swedish residents are registered resident aliens holding a personal ID number (similar to an American Social Security number). Generally, their tuition is less than others, due to Government subsidies.
